SECOND SCHEDULE

Land at Lynwood, Blackpool Road, Newton with Clifton, PR4 3RU shown edged red on the attached site location plan.

Notes:

- 1. This certificate is issued solely for the purpose of section 191 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- 2. It certifies that the use and operations specified in the First Schedule taking place on the land described in the Second Schedule was lawful on the specified date and

therefore was not liable to enforcement action under Part 7 of the 1990 Act on that date.

3. This certificate applies only to the extent of the use and operations described in the First Schedule and to the land specified in the Second Schedule and identified on the attached plan. Any use or operations which are materially different from that described or which relates to other land may render the owner or occupier liable to enforcement action.
